

Maths

- Can you find examples of a cone, cylinder, cube, cuboid, sphere or pyramid around your house? Can you describe them using the words edges and faces?
- Can you quickly recall double and halving facts up to 12+12
- Can you count in steps of 2, 5 and 10?
- Can you compare 2 numbers up to 100 by talking about their tens and units?
- Can you count confidently to 100?

PE

- Can you make up some dance moves to represent your favourite toys? We practiced puppets and toy soldiers in our lessons at school. How could you dance like a robot or teddy bear?
- Can you invent a game to play outside with a friend? Think about how you could score points.

Reading

Remember to try and read with your child every evening for 10 minutes. A document including questions to ask your child during reading has been uploaded onto the school website. We love to hear about the books you have been enjoying at home.

Topic

- Can you order toys or other objects at home from newest to oldest?
- Can you make a model and decide how to join the different parts together?
- Can you sketch a picture and shade in the light and dark parts?
- Can you find something old in your house which you might find in a museum? You could write some facts or find out information about it using the internet or books.

English

- Can you read some of your favourite stories and talk about how they are similar and different? Who are your favourite characters?
- Can you find words ending in -ing? Do you notice anything about the spelling of these words? Can you find examples of words which need to drop the 'e' before adding -ing?
- Can you practice writing sentences which join 2 ideas together using 'and'?

Phonics

Look out for a page stuck inside your child's reading record coming soon! This will specify which tricky words your child needs to practice reading and spelling. Tricky words are words which cannot be sounded out and we have to learn by sight. We practice stomping these out to help us remember.
