

Maths

- Can you write an addition number sentence and then 'undo' it using subtraction?
- Can you use multiplication to solve a problem? For example: there are 4 giants, each giant eats 5 apples, how many apples altogether?
- Can you practise telling the time when it is half past the hour?
- Can you find some things in the kitchen and order them from heaviest to lightest?
- Can you spot any 5, 6 or 8 sided shapes in your house? Can you remember the names of these shapes?

PE

- Can you invent a game which involves throwing something at a target? How could you score points in your game?
- Can you play a game of quick cricket with your family? You might need to teach them the rules first.

Reading

Remember to try and read together every evening for 10 minutes. Try and make some time to practise reading and spelling the tricky words inside your reading record too. We would love to hear about the fun games you play to help you learn tricky words!
