- Can you order the days of the weeks, and months of the year?
- Can you describe the weather in the different seasons?
- Can you learn the names of the different coins? (1p - £2)
- Can you learn all the pairs of numbers that total 10? (Number bonds to 10)
- Can you practice counting in 2's both forwards and backwards?
- Can you sort the numbers to 50 into odd and even?
- Can you make symmetrical patterns and check them using a mirror?

PE

Can you practice the different shapes that we learnt in gymnastics?

We have put together some ideas you could use if you would like to support your child's learning at home. All of the activities suggested in this document will help consolidate your child's learning as we have covered these objectives during the autumn term. Thank you for your support 😊



Topic

- Can you sort objects around the house according to the material they are made from? (wood, plastic, metal, glass, fabric)
- Can you produce a piece of artwork in the style of Bridget Riley?
- Can you produce a piece of art work in the style of Piet Mondrian?
- Can you create a piece of artwork that only uses primary colours?
- Can you sort animals into nocturnal and diurnal?

English

- Can you read different poems and spot the adjectives used? (Adjectives are describing words)
- Can you spot the alliteration used in the different poems? (Alliteration is the repetition of the same sound at the beginning of each or most of the words in a sentence)
- Can you write a book review of a book you have recently read? (A book review sheet has been uploaded to the school website)
- Can you write facts about different animals you have learnt about? Make sure you use a capital letter at the beginning of the sentence, finger spaces between each word and full stop at the end.

Phonics

Look out for a page stuck inside your child's reading record coming soon! This will specify which tricky words your child needs to practice reading and spelling. Tricky words are words which cannot be sounded out and we have to learn by sight. We practice stomping these out to help us remember.

Reading

Don't forget to try and read with your child every evening for around 10 minutes. A document including questions to ask your child during reading has been uploaded onto the school website.
