At Ashleigh, we actively encourage children to make positive choices, knowing that they are in a safe and supportive environment. We also encourage children to be reflective of their choices and teach children how to communicate and express their feelings within PATHS lessons. We provide a safe environment, staff with whom have positive and supportive relationships with their pupils and secure boundaries to enable children to make choices safely. Children are taught to know, understand and exercise their rights but also their responsibility to consider how making their choice will impact on themselves and others.
