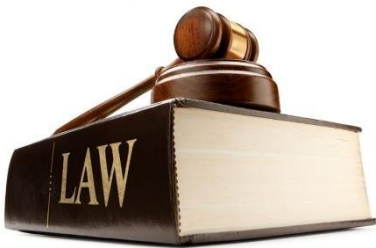

At Ashleigh Primary School & Nursery, we encourage and promote good behaviour and attitudes to learning. We teach children to understand that rules are needed keep them safe and enable them to learn.

We are committed to praising children's efforts and endeavour to praise children informally, individually, during group learning, in front of the whole class and school celebration assemblies. Children are rewarded not only for achievement in curriculum areas, but also for behaviour and demonstration of values. Rewards are given in the form of stickers, house points, class dojo points, certificates, visits to the farm and 'golden time'. Children's achievements are also noted by Mr Nixon in our special 'Gold book'.

What are ways we can show justice and fairness at our school?

1. Treat all people equally.
2. Cooperate with one another.
3. Be respectful and listen to what others have to say.
4. Be willing to do what is best for everyone.
5. Play by the rules at all times; be a good sport.
6. Include others in games and activities. Don't leave people out.
7. Understand that being fair doesn't always mean the same treatment in every circumstance.
8. Stand-up for someone you see being treated unfairly – you can make a difference!
