We have been thinking about ourselves and how we are all different and special. The children have been attempting self-portraits using mirrors to decide which colours to use and where to put their features. The results are fabulous so far and will be displayed in both rooms once the paint is dry! In our carpet sessions we have been singing lots of counting rhymes using numbers 1 to 5, or 1 to 10. We have been counting up, down, one more, one less and using our fingers to help us. We have also enjoyed using our voices to make all different kinds of sounds, loud sounds and quiet sounds, animal noises and of course singing.

Next week we will move on to a new topic all about Autumn. The children will be thinking about the seasonal changes that they notice at this time year. We will be looking closely at leaves, conkers, pine cones and noticing the patterns and lines we can see. The children will have the opportunity to try lots of different Autumn themed crafts throughout the topic to extend their learning.

Wellies – please add these to the racks provided in the Nursery playground

Please also ensure that children's bags are visibly named.

Home/School books

This week your child will bring home a large red book to support 'home/school links', we are always keen to hear about the places you visit, your child's interests or their achievements. The books can contain pictures, paintings, messages, post cards, tickets, information leaflets etc. We love to spend time with the children talking about their interests and these books also help us to plan from the children. Use them as little or as much as you like, if you have something to share then hand it to a member of staff – we will always write back!

Funding

Please make sure you check and update your 30 hours funding code regularly. **You'll need to reconfirm your eligibility every 3 months on the government gateway website.** More information is available via your government gateway online account. Please ask Mrs Howard in the school office if you have any funding queries.

Funding forms were sent home this week, if you could complete and return these to Nursery as soon as possible. We are aware that there may be some forms which we have calculated incorrectly (apologies, this is the first time we've completed them and they are not the clearest of forms!) If you have any queries please do contact the office.

Wisepay – Lunch Ordering

All children who stay for lunch at any point during the week should have received log-in details and information about booking and paying for lunches online. Children can still bring home packed lunches if you prefer but please have a look at the menu to see if there's anything your child would like to try. Meals are £1.50 for Nursery children, Wisepay have applied a reduction to Nursery meals so you should not be charged £2.20, but again, this is the first time we're using this system for Nursery so please let us know of any questions. Lunches can be booked up to half term currently. If you need to change the meal choice, or your child is absent, please contact the school office.

Invoices for lunch sessions for this half term will be issued in October.

Autumn craft sessions

To celebrate the changing season and our Autumn topic we will be inviting you to drop into Nursery to complete an Autumn themed craft with your child during the week beginning 16th October. Sign-up sheets will be available from next week. If you are unable to attend any of the slots but would like to complete the activity at home or arrange a different time to drop in please speak to one of Nursery team.

Home/Nursery Links

Each week we will suggest some activities you could do at home with your child to support their learning in Nursery.

- Sing a counting rhyme with your child, some of our favourites are “Zoom zoom zoom” “5 little monkeys” “Here is the beehive”. Please do ask if you need ideas!
- Sing a noisy Nursery rhyme with your child – such as Wheels on the Bus, or Old McDonald has a farm. How many different noises can you make? Are they loud or quiet?
- We are always happy to help but we try to promote independence wherever possible in Nursery. Please help your child to practice putting on shoes, wellies and coats by themselves. Can they make a start on their own?
- Talk about seasonal changes as you go about your weekend – notice the leaves changing colour, the weather changing and the night times getting darker etc.
