# Year 1 Homework Spring 1

We have put together some ideas you could use if you would like to support your child's learning at home. All of the activities suggested in this document will help consolidate your child's learning as we have covered these objectives during the autumn term. Thank you for your support 😊



## Topic

- Can you sort objects around the house according to the material they are made from? (wood, plastic, metal, glass, fabric)
- Can you produce a piece of artwork in the style of Bridget Riley?
- Can you produce a piece of art work in the style of Piet Mondrian?
- Can you create a piece of artwork that only uses primary colours?
- Can you sort animals into nocturnal and diurnal?

## English

- Can you read different poems and spot the adjectives used? (Adjectives are describing words)
- Can you spot the alliteration used in the different poems? (Alliteration is the repetition of the same sound at the beginning of each or most of the words in a sentence e.g. silver spinning sparkles)
- Can you write a book review of a book you have recently read?
- Can you write facts about different animals you have learnt about? Make sure you use a capital letter at the beginning of the sentence, finger spaces between each word and full stop at the end.

## Phonics

Make sure you use the sound mat and the suggested games which are stuck into your reading diary to practice phonics.

Practise reading and spelling Phase 4 and Phase 5 tricky words. Tricky words are words which cannot be sounded out and we have to learn by sight.

## Reading

Don't forget to try and read with your child every evening for around 10 minutes. A document including questions to ask your child during reading can be found in the Year 1 > Learning section of the school website.
