This Week

We have launched into learning all about spring! We have been talking to the children about the changes they might notice in the world around them at this time of year, for example; flowers, blossom, buds, baby animals, birds building nests and bees buzzing.

We have also been thinking about planting and growing. We have planted some herb and vegetable seeds which we will grow indoors until they are strong enough to plant out. This week we practised our listening skills – playing an “I can hear a number” game where the children have to listen carefully to count musical sounds.

Next week

Next week we will continue to learn about spring, moving on to learn about animals at this time of year and growing in more detail. To support this we will be doing lots of spring scavenger hunts outside where we will explore the school grounds to hunt for signs of spring. We will also be planting some seeds on the farm to begin our growing season. At the end of the week we will begin to talk about Easter, why it is celebrated and explore some Easter traditions.

This week we have watched and then responded to a short film, ‘The Rainbow People’, this animation explores ideas of equality and diversity and how life is enriched by every individual’s unique and special qualities, it also helped us to think about the power of us working as a team.

Treat

The children have been collecting "bugs in a jug" as rewards for brilliant learning behaviour over this term. The jug is now full and the children have chosen a short movie with popcorn. We are going to link this to World Book Day and have the treat on Thursday 22nd March and again on Tuesday 27th March, hopefully this will mean most children get to have the treat, but we will vary the day of treats each time to ensure everyone is involved.

Drop off and collection – after Easter

Each year after Easter we promote children's independence skills by encouraging them to come into Nursery by themselves, to hang up their coat, put bags and water bottles away, self-register and find an activity.

Nursery adults are stationed in the cloakrooms and on the carpet areas to provide support with this as needed. At hometime the Nursery staff support the children with collecting their belongings and then we dismiss the children one by one from the main door once we have seen their adult who will be waiting on the playground.

Every year we are amazed at how the children respond by rising to the challenge and how proud and important they feel to be doing something so grown up! We will start with the new routine from the second week back after Easter - Monday 23rd April.

Before and after school club drop offs and collections remain the same - these children will also manage their own belongings with support when they arrive and leave Nursery each day.

Book day events rescheduled

The world book day events which were cancelled last week have been rescheduled. The Story Café will now take place on Wednesday 21st March and the world book day dressing up day will take place on Thursday 22nd March.

We are assuming those attending the Story Café will still be attending the new date, please see the school office if this has changed.

Holiday Policy

Due to the changes in government policy relating to Nursery funding we no longer receive payment when children are absent from Nursery due to holiday. In order to align our practice with other providers the governors have agreed a change in policy which will come into effect from the summer term 2018.

From the 16th April 2018 if you are planning a holiday during term time we will require a four week notice period and you will be invoiced for the hours lost.

Funding

Please make sure you check and update your 30 hours funding code regularly.

You need to reconfirm your eligibility every three months on the government gateway website.
