This Week

We have been learning all about caterpillars! Our five caterpillars arrived in Nursery on Wednesday, they have been eating and eating – we will watch closely to notice the changes that happen over the next few weeks! We started the week with the classic story of 'The Hungry Caterpillar', the children enjoyed the repeating phrases and vibrant illustrations of this book. Throughout the week the children read other Eric Carle stories, watched video clips and listened to other audio stories by Eric Carle.

Next week

Next week is the half term holiday and Nursery is closed. On our return we will spend a week learning about butterflies. This week will be full of learning about colour and pattern, basic symmetry and shape. The children will enjoy hunting for butterflies outside and noticing their actions.

PATHS

We have returned to our understanding of our feelings through the stories 'Missing' and 'The Gruffalo's Child'. The children are amazing at naming whether a feeling is either 'comfortable' or 'uncomfortable' but often describe all uncomfortable situations as 'sad'.

We have been reflecting on the other uncomfortable emotions such as, 'surprise', 'upset', and 'cross' etc.

THUNK of the week – thinking about thinking....

Where does a rainbow start and end?

Exactly how does an egg change into a caterpillar, a caterpillar into a butterfly?

Word Aware

This week our 'word of the week' is delicate.

We have learnt the word *delicate* and what it means and have thought about things which are delicate. We made up an action for the word and took special care with our Nursery caterpillars which are very delicate! To extend this idea further we also talked about how we can feel delicate when we are unwell for example.

Holiday Policy

Due to the changes in government policy relating to Nursery funding we no longer receive payment when children are absent from Nursery due to holiday. In order to align our practice with other providers the governors have agreed a change in policy which will come into effect from the summer term 2018.

From the 16th April 2018 if you are planning a holiday during term time we will require a four week notice period and you will be invoiced for the hours lost.

Story Competition

Home/Nursery Links

Each week we will suggest some activities you could do at home with your child to support their learning in Nursery.

- Find some objects which are “delicate” – how do you know?
- Can you find 2D shapes in the world around you? Circle, square, rectangle, triangle?
