To access this, please log on to your Tapestry account, click on menu and then your name on the top right and you will see an option for "PDF downloads". From this link you should see your child's Learning Journal as a PDF file for you to download and save.

These files will be available to download for a limited time. If you are not registered on the Tapestry system please let us know and we can email or send you a copy of the Learning Journal.

Holiday Policy

Due to the changes in government policy relating to Nursery funding we no longer receive payment when children are absent from Nursery due to holiday. In order to align our practice with other providers the governors have agreed a change in policy which will come into effect from the summer term 2018.

If you are planning a holiday during term time we will require a four week notice period and you will be invoiced for the hours lost.

Home/Nursery Links

Each week we will suggest some activities you could do at home with your child to support their learning. Over the summer;

- Go on a number hunt – what numbers can you see all around you? Play the game in shops, while driving or walking. Can you “collect” all the numbers to 10?
- Can you make some “silly soup”? – grab a bowl and a spoon and collect objects beginning with the same letter that your name starts with.
- If you go somewhere different on holiday or a day out notice how far it is, how you travelled there and what the weather is like.
- Practice large and fine motor skills, can you draw circles and zig zags and stripes outside in the air, with bubbles or with water on a paintbrush.
- Look at your new school website or brochure and notice some of things you might see on your first day.
- Have lots of rest and fun so you are ready for Reception!
