### This week

The children have enjoyed learning about birds in Spring. We collected eggs on the farm and found an old bird's nest which we examined closely to notice all of the materials the birds used to build it. We watched a video of a bird building a nest and noticed how they weave the materials using their beaks. Following this the children made chocolate bird's nest cakes and had a go at building their own nests from various materials.

In phonics we continued learning to hear rhyming words, trying to match rhyming pairs and notice the odd word out in rhyming games.

In maths we sang lots of number rhymes which involve basic subtraction – 5 little ducks, 5 little fishes, zoom zoom zoom and noticed that the numbers were getting smaller as we took something away.

### Word of the week

Our word of the week this week was "hatch", we talked about what hatching means. We learnt how birds make a nest and keep their eggs warm until they hatch.

### Next week

We will be continuing with our Spring topic, moving on to learning about Easter. Now that the weather is a bit better, we will be taking small groups of children on Spring walks within the school grounds to spot signs of Spring.

In phonics we will be using the musical instruments to copy patterns.

In maths we will be learning about number patterns – for example seeing 4 dots on a dice and knowing that there is "4" without counting.

We are holding some stay and play sessions in the last week of term, you are invited to come into Nursery to join us for some Easter crafts with a focus on how we teach skills for early writing and fine motor control.

### Pet topic

After the Easter Holidays will be learning about pets. This is always a very popular topic with the children. We have guinea pigs, a rabbit, chickens and the school dog which will visit Nursery so that we can learn how to care for pets.

If you have a small or unusual pet at home that you would be able to bring into Nursery to visit as part of our topic please let Mrs Sprake know. In the past we have had visiting snakes, stick insects, tortoises, rabbits and a bearded dragon.

Please send children to Nursery in shoes that they can fasten themselves. Shoes with laces that can come untied are not suitable for Nursery, unless your child is confident with managing these themselves.
