### This week

The children came back from the holiday eager to tell us all about their half term adventures, they spoke confidently and enjoyed telling their friends their news.

We have been learning about worms and other mini-beasts this week. We learnt that worms live under the soil and are good for the garden because they help to mix the soil. The children were excited to study worms closely using magnifying glasses and microscopes.

In maths we used counting and number patterns to help us add small numbers, we also compared the length of worms to find the shortest and the longest.

In phonics we listened to rhyming stories and found rhyming pairs.

On Thursday Lucy from Mini-Professors came to run our workshops. The children were absolutely enthralled and took part in lots of hands-on activities, they mixed acids and bases and enjoyed watching colour changing and fizzing reactions.

Our Butterflies emerged from their chrysalides this week, we have five painted lady butterflies. The children were fascinated to watch them dry their wings and feed from flowers. On Friday we released them into the wild.
