This Week

Book week has been as fabulous as ever this year, the children were so excited to show us their favourite books from home and to wear their character costumes to Nursery. All week we have enjoyed learning more about books, looking at the covers to notice clues that might tell us more about the book and reading the blurb on the back to find out more. We have talked about favourite characters and what happens at the beginning, middle and end of the story. The children visited the school library and were challenged to find a book that they had never read before, we brought these back to the classrooms and had great fun reading lots of new stories. On Friday Year 5 came to see us to share some stories they had written, everyone enjoyed their visit!

We have also been reminding the children about the importance of hand washing to keep themselves healthy.

Next Week

We move on to our Spring topic next week. We will be noticing the first signs of Spring appearing all around us (shoots, buds, new leaves, changes in the weather and light). In phonics we are challenging the children to hear rhyming words in stories and to think of words that rhyme with their name.

In maths we are working out simple problems, such as finding the total of two groups in practical activities. You can support at home by doing lots of counting and spotting numbers all around you.

Nursery/Home School Links

- Can you recognise numbers to 5 or 10 all around you?
- When you read a story at home, ask your child questions such as "I wonder what might happen next?" or "how did the story end?"
- Notice signs of Spring when you are walking to school or at the park. Can you find any signs of Spring in your garden at home?
- Can you spot flowers such as daffodils and crocuses?
- We are beginning to learn about rhyme. When you are reading stories at home can you spot words that rhyme?
Can you think of a word that rhymes with your name?
