This week

The children very much enjoyed the sound story “Peace at Last”, we listened to the sounds in the story and tried our best to copy these sounds using our voices. This “tuning in” to sounds helps the children to get used to the skills needed to start learning their phonemes in Reception.

Later in the week we used our careful listening skills to see if we could guess mystery sounds, we listened carefully to work out if the sounds were quiet or loud and used lots of describing words to talk about each one – for example a crunchy, snapping sound or a soft, quiet sound.

Next week is slightly shorter as we close for the half term holiday.

We will be dissecting pumpkins next week to see what is inside! Outside we will be bulb planting with our fantastic gardening donations (thank you!).

I have been so impressed this half term with how quickly the children have adapted to their new Nursery and have taken responsibility for coming in independently. They have amazed us, and we think it is going to be a brilliant year.

Thank you for all your support in these very different circumstances and have a great half term holiday.

After the holiday we will learn about colours, using the story “Wow said the Owl” by Tim Hopgood.

Session Availability


We have the following permanent spaces available:
