## Covid & Attendance

- If someone has tested positive for Covid in the household, Government guidelines are that children who feel well and have no symptoms can continue to come to school, unless they develop symptoms themselves.
- We are asking parents, where possible, to keep children at home during the isolation period of their family member because the Norfolk Outbreak Management Team are advising that schools take a low threshold approach to stop the spread of Covid.
- We will supply home learning for all children in this situation.
- Parents can still choose to send any child displaying no symptoms, in which case we ask that a lateral flow test is done every morning, with a negative result, before they come into school.

We really appreciate your support as we try to keep the whole school and community as safe and well as possible.

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## Ashleigh Friends - Christmas Card Fundraiser

- This year we are giving you the opportunity for your child's artwork to be produced into Christmas cards, plus extras, using local company Creative Lincs. and help us raise money for the PTA.
- If you would like to take part you will need your child to produce their own piece of artwork at home, which will be edited and reproduced into full colour A6 Cards with envelopes.
- Your child's name will be on the back of the card as the designer along with the school logo and a "Merry Christmas & Happy New Year" message printed inside.
- Artwork guidelines: Artwork can be drawn or painted onto any A5/A4 paper. Please ensure that the artwork avoids going to the very edge of the page as some of the detail maybe lost.
- Please avoid florescent & neon colours and don't use glitter as it doesn't transfer well into a printed card. If using glue be mindful that this will appear onto the card so less is more and that any glued-on elements are flat (googly eyes and cotton wool doesn't allow the card to sit flat in the production process).
- Ordering: Ordering is very simple. Please complete the order form (sent via email) and attach it to the back of the artwork with tape (please avoid stapling to the artwork otherwise holes or a big metal line will be evident!). Don't fold them either. Please clearly fill in your child's name and name of the class.
- Be sure to fill in exactly what you require to be printed and return it and the money or cheque payable to Ashleigh Friends to the school office in a sealed envelope labelled with your child's name and class by Tuesday 16th November.
- Unfortunately, **if we do not receive your order into school by 16th November there will be a delay in getting the completed cards to you.**
- Full prices and details are on the order form. Orders will be given to your children to bring home in early December.

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## Norfolk Festive Holiday Fun

- The Big Norfolk Holiday Fun Festive programme is open to **all children and young people aged 5-16** (or 4 if they're slightly younger but in full time education). There are lots of providers signed up to the programme, and something for everyone to enjoy. This could be music, sports and leisure or arts and crafts. It could also include cultural and drama sessions.
- A set number of free spaces on each activity can be claimed by children who receive means-tested free school meals. **If your child receives means-tested Free School Meals, please contact the school office for the code** which will enable you to book a free place on Big Norfolk Holiday Fun activities.

Mrs Miller recommends this book to: Anyone who likes a giggle!

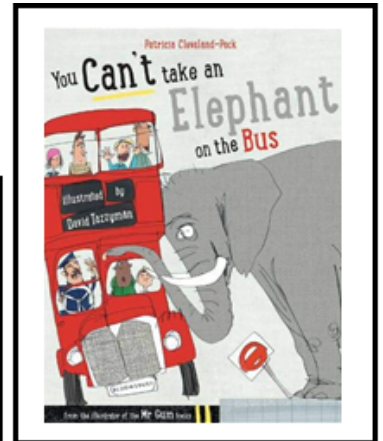
*A friend of mine once asked me what makes a child fall in love with a book. I believe that, not only does someone fall in love with a book because of the actual story, but that they also fall in love with the memories created whilst sharing that book with the ones they love.*

*This is so true for the book I am recommending today. Every time I read this book, it takes me straight back to sitting in my garden in the summer, listening to my two children snuggled up in their tent! The giggling and enjoyment as they shared this book together, discovering which animal might try to travel on which transport, and exploring how the illustrator has captured the animal's expressions and feelings in such a witty and fun way, are what creates those lasting memories of falling in love with a book!*

*As well as being very funny, this book is a lovely introduction to rhyme and verse, and lends itself perfectly to developing imagination and problem solving language - I mean just imagine trying to take an elephant on a bus...!*
