Governor Vacancy

Would you be interested in becoming a Governor of Ashleigh? Have you ever considered it? We are looking for more individuals to join our lively and dynamic Governing Board.

- The 3 core functions of a Governing Board are:
 - Ensuring clarity of vision, ethos and strategic direction for Ashleigh;
 - Holding executive leaders to account for the educational performance of the organisation and its pupils, and the effective and efficient performance management of staff; and
 - Overseeing the financial performance of the organisation and making sure it's money well spent.
- Essentially, what this means is that as Governors we act as "critical friends" to the school leadership team and provide challenge and support from the different perspectives and backgrounds that we all have. The role is a strategic one rather than operational. We meet twice a term – at the moment via Zoom – for a meeting that we try our best to keep to 2 hours and in between those meetings there would be some work involved in reading reports and papers for the upcoming meeting and carrying out monitoring activities. If you were interested we would introduce you at a pace to suit yourself. No prior experience in education is required, just a willingness to contribute to the ongoing successes of Ashleigh.
- We are particularly looking for anyone that has an interest or background in health and safety, the wider community, the national curriculum, keeping the website updated and overseeing and implementing new school policy.
- As a Governing Board we are quite heavily dominated by parents of children in the school. Whilst this is not a problem in and of itself, we would like to see if there is anyone from outside the school community that would be willing to give it a go. Having said that, we understand that those who become Governors tend to do so because of their child/ren attending the school so parents, please feel happy to apply too!

- The whole school has started working on a community arts project.
- Our first theme was: 'We are all in the same storm, but we are not all in the same boats'. There are some fantastic displays popping up around the school where children have used art to express their experiences. We look forward to sharing this with you in a virtual 'Gallery of Hope' later in the term.
- Our next theme is: 'We are part of a big picture' and the whole school will be working together to make a giant jigsaw of our feelings. The children will reflect on comfortable and uncomfortable feelings and will each make 2 pieces for our jigsaw puzzle. You may want to discuss the follow things at home:
 - What comfortable feelings can you think of? (Happy, excited, calm...)
 - How does your body respond to comfortable feelings?
 - What uncomfortable feelings can you think of? (Sad, anxious, frustrated, jealous, angry...)
 - How does your body respond to uncomfortable feelings?
