## Updated Guidance for Keeping Children Safe Online

The government have updated their guidance for [parents and carers to keep children safe online](#). The measures announced over recent weeks to tackle coronavirus (COVID-19), although essential, have disrupted people's day-to-day lives.

As a result of these necessary measures, almost all of us are likely to be spending more time online, including children. This guidance contains resources for parents and carers to help keep children safe online.

## Online Safety

- We have been made aware this week of an incident that happened on Roblox.
- Advice about how to monitor children's online safety and what to do if you are concerned about content/contact within the game can be found at [UK Safer Internet Use Parent Guide](#):



Make use of the safety features available (specifically for Roblox below but the principles would be the same for all games):-

- **Block and report:**

Make sure your child knows how to find and use the report and block functions. Use the [Roblox how to make a report page](#) to learn how to do this.

- **Safety settings:**

Set up the parental controls that are right for your family. You can also disable chat, set up the Parent PIN and use the Account Restrictions within Roblox. [Click here](#) for more information on how to use the Safety features.

- **Settings for under 13s:**

There are additional safety features for under-13s , so it's worth checking your child's account is registered with the correct age. Players under the age of 13 have a <13 symbol next to their username on the game at all times, however this is not displayed to other players.

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## World Book Day - Thursday 4<sup>th</sup> March

- This year we will be sending out the £1 World Book Day vouchers via pdf, which can be downloaded at home and shown in place of the paper voucher.
- The paper voucher will be sent home when children return to school.
- Ketts Books in Wymondham will be extending the timeframe to accept the vouchers to the summer holidays (at least), they are also offering a click and collect service if you wish to choose a book during lockdown.
